<p>Signage</p>	<p>When the substance is applied in an indoor environment, the person in charge of the</p>

application area and the person in charge of the application of the agrichemical must ensure that signs are erected outside of the application area, at every routine point of entry into the application area. Signs must be posted from the start of commencement of application, until the end of the application or Restricted Entry Interval (REI), whichever is the later.

(2) Signs erected in accordance with sub clause (1) must –

(a) state that application is being carried out using a agrichemical that is toxic to humans; and
(b) state that entry into the application area is not permitted unless PPE and RPE are worn.

(3) Signs erected in accordance with sub clauses (1) and (2) must –

(a) comply with regulation 34(1), (2), and (4) and regulation 35(1), (3), and (5) of the Hazardous Substances (Identification) Regulations 2001, but as if the distances referred to in regulation 35(3) were a distance of not less than 10 metres; and
(b) identify the person in charge of the application; and

(c) state the day on which the application commenced; and

(d) state the time and date of the end of the REI.

(4) Signs must be removed within 3 days (72 hours) of the end of the application or REI, whichever is the later.
